While many animation studios have turned to computer-generated imaging, the artists at Aardman prefer to work with their hands, molding their characters from plasticine and placing them in miniaturized sets, then adjusting, repositioning and manipulating, the limbs, the eves and the mouths, frame by painstaking frame, to bring their characters to life. The resulting films are Infused with humanity and a level of artistry unachievable by any other method.



Aardman's Humdrum was the 1999 NYICFF Grand Prize winner and went on to be nominated for an Oscar. Now the phenomenal success of Chicken Run, the first of five feature films being made for DreamWorks, has brought Aardman Animations to the attention of the American mainstream.
